### **MAJOR CHANGES FOR THE 2021 KJLS**

- COVID 19. All persons entering the KJLS facility must adhere to the current State, County, and City COVID 19 recommended guidelines. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in the removal and/or disqualification from the 2021 show and premises.
- 2. Market Steers. The Market Steer Classes have been changed to a total of three classes (Light, Medium, and Heavy weight.) A maximum of 12 steers may sell in the auction. (see pg 16)
- 3. Fitting in the Special Events Center: No Professional Fitters. No animals will be fitted, fed, handled, or attended to at the Killeen Junior Livestock Show by anyone other than an exhibitor, immediate family member (including grandparents), a parent of a 2021 KJLSA exhibitor, or an Agriculture Science Advisor / 4H Leader/Volunteer or Bell County Extension Agent (4H Leaders/Volunteers must be a Bell County Agrilife approved and registered volunteer). Violation of this rule may result in the exhibitor forfeiting all prize money, auction sale money, add-on money, ribbons, banners, buckles, and other awards and may be banned from future shows. (see pg 10)
- 4. Single Fryer Entry An exhibitor may enter and show one single fryer rabbit for each pen of three (3) fryer rabbits entered. (For clarity, if an exhibitor submits an online entry with payment for a pen of three rabbits and a single rabbit entry, they are eligible to show the single rabbit entry regardless if the pen of three is shown. The single fryer rabbit cannot come from a fryer pen of three (3) that is checked in or exhibited as a pen of three (3). Single fryers must weigh between 3 5.5 lbs. (see pg 15)
- 5. Animals sold through the Auction Sale are ineligible to be shown in any other show. The KJLSA will report validation numbers of all animals being sold to the county extension office and state. The KJLSA Board of Directors reserves the right to brand or remove validation tags and leg bands of all animals and fowl being sold through the auction. (see pg 11)
- 6. Clean Up. The penalty for exhibitors not attending the mandatory clean-up on Friday night and Saturday after the auction have been raised to \$75 for each clean-up missed. Penalties will be retained from any net proceeds. (see pg 9)
- Breeding Rabbit Classes. Breeding Rabbit classes have been realigned (see pg 18).

### **GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES**

NOTE TO ALL EXHIBITORS AND PARENTS: All exhibitors and parent/ guardians are cautioned to read the following rules and regulations carefully as they will be strictly enforced. Anyone in violation of rules prior to, during or after exhibition of their project, may result in the exhibitor being disqualified and forfeiting all prize money, auction sale money, addon money, ribbons, banners and all other awards, and may be banned from future shows. The Killeen Junior Livestock Show and Auction Board of Directors will make the final decision.

### I. Eligibility

Exhibitors: The Killeen Livestock Show is held annually, primarily for the purpose of exhibition of livestock and fowl raised by FFA and 4-H Club students who reside within the Killeen Independent School District. Exhibitors in the Killeen Junior Livestock show must not be less than eight (8) years of age and presently enrolled in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, and have not reached their 20<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1, 2021. They must be attending public or private elementary, middle school or high school in KISD and must be a bona fide, active, FFA or 4-H Club member located in KISD and be in good standing in his or her club, as of December 10, 2020.

Students graduating from high school between December 16, 2020 and the time of the Show, providing they meet all other qualifications, will be eligible to participate in the Show.

- Students living WITHIN THE KILLEEN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ATTENDING SCHOOLS WITHIN THE DISTRICT must comply with all of the Official Rules.
- 2) Those students LIVING OUTSIDE of the Killeen Independent School District that ATTEND SCHOOLS IN THE DISTRICT must make application to the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association by September 15, 2020 to participate in the show. The decision of the Association is final. These students must comply with all Official Rules.
- 3) Students living WITHIN the Killeen Independent School District that attend school OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT must make application to the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association by September 15, 2020 to participate in the show. The decision of the Association is final. These students must comply with all Official Rules.
- Students exhibiting breeding animals, competing in Ag Mechanics, or the Cooking Division must meet the same eligibility requirements as market classes.
- 5) All entries must be exhibited by the owner except when an exhibitor has more than one entry in a class. A written request must be submitted to the KJLSA Show Secretary explaining the reason for the substitution. THE EXHIBITORS MUST ALSO REPORT THE SUBSTITUTION TO THE SHOW SECRETARY NO LATER THAN FIFTEEN (15) MINUTES PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF THE CLASS. Only a bona fide 4-H or FFA member who qualifies under the UIL eligibility rule may be substituted and the substitute exhibitor must meet the qualifications for the class of animals that they will be exhibiting (i.e. market or breeding). If an exhibitor is not passing according to UIL rules, the exhibitor is not eligible to participate in the livestock show and the animals will not be allowed in the barn and no substitutions will be allowed.

### **II. GENERAL RULES**

- Facilities: All exhibitors are responsible for helping to prepare, maintain and clean up the facilities where the Junior Livestock Show and Auction will be held.
- 2) Setting Classes: The Board of Directors will establish the schedule of divisions and classes and number of places and type of awards. Classes will be divided and set according to weight, breed, or age as indicated in the rules for each species.
- 3) Entries:
  - a) To be submitted ON LINE https://killeen.fairwire.com
  - ENTRY FEES: \$5.00 per entry (Livestock, Ag Mechanics, and Cooking). To be paid via credit card or paypal.
  - DEADLINE FOR ENTRY JANUARY 8, 2021, before 11:59 p.m.
     All entries must be certified and signed by the FFA Instructor, or by
    - the 4-H leader, or the County Agent.

Show officials may require records as proof of ownership on exhibit animals. No animal or fowl that has been sold, traded, purchased or received as a gift from anyone after the deadline will be eligible to be shown or sold at the Killeen Junior Livestock Show and Auction.

Every exhibitor must agree to allow unannounced visitation of agents of the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association to the location where the animal is being fed. Releases should be completed at the time of validation, stating the date of possession, exhibitor, and location of animal. Any changes of location must be reported to the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association immediately. Animals not being fed at the location and by the exhibitor as stated on the release may be disqualified.

- 4) No one other than the judge, exhibitor, superintendent & photographer will be allowed in the show ring. The exhibitor must lead and show his or her own animal while in the show ring. Removal of the animal will be per the discretion of the division superintendent.
- b) Undesirable and unruly animals will not be permitted in the show.
  a. Health Rule: Special care will be taken that animals or fowl having diseases or external parasite of any nature will not be admitted into the show at any time. Unhealed animals from castration, dehorning, or other operations may be barred from the show. Exhibitors must comply with all rules and regulations set forth by the Texas Animal Health Commission. Breeding and Market Animals do not require health certificates.
  - b. Sift and Weight. All animals must be of good show quality, including condition and grooming. All animals must pass a quality sift in addition to weight requirements for market animals. Underweight and overweight animals will be removed from the barn immediately after weigh-in. Exhibitors will not use extreme, unhealthy, or unsafe measures to meet exhibit weight requirements while in the barn. All sifted animals must be removed from the exhibition barn. They are not eligible for floor price at the sale.
  - c. Unruly Animals. Animals displaying unruly behaviors and that pose a safety risk to people and /or other exhibits, may be removed from the barn and from exhibiting. The decision to remove the animal will be at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors.
- 6) Ear Tags or Leg Bands may be placed on animals and fowl at the time they are brought to the show.
- 7) In/Out:
  - a) All entries except breeding rabbits must be in place by 6:00 p.m. of the opening day. Entries arriving after 6:00 p.m., but before 7:00 p.m. will be allowed in the barn but must pay a penalty of \$100.00 per entry. All market entries must remain in place until the conclusion of that species show, except in the case of emergency, and this must be approved by the Division Superintendent. Exhibitors may remove their market animals after notifying their respective Division Superintendent and gaining approval. No animals will be removed while other animals are being judged. The removal of animals will not distract from any scheduled events. Once a market animal has been removed from the barn, that animal is no longer eligible for the auction. All Breeding entries may be released at the conclusion of that species breeding show after approval from the Division Superintendent.
  - b) Once animals have been accepted into the Show Barn and approved they will not leave the building without the approval of the appropriate Division Superintendent. Failure to adhere to this provision may cause such animal to be disqualified.
  - c) Pen Assignments Two(2) animals (goats, sheep, and swine) per pen. Pens will be numbered and will be assigned on a first come-first serve bases. INDIVIDUALS MAY NOT RESERVE PENS DURING SET-UP. Pens will be assigned by club and / or chapter.
  - d) The Barn will be secured at 11:00 p.m. every night. No one will be allowed in the barn after this time.
- 8) Animal Testing: Entry of an animal in the Killeen Junior Livestock Show shall constitute the owner to test such animal. Any animal entered in the show and accepted on weigh-in day shall be subject to testing for drugs and/or disease. The decision to test shall be at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors. Such testing may be random or specific.

Testing shall be done by a licensed veterinarian designated by the Board of Directors. The owner of the animal or his/her representative shall have the right to be present at any testing. Such testing shall be observed by at least two Directors.

### Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association Scholarship Program

The Killeen Junior Livestock Association Scholarship Program was established to reward graduating seniors that meet the eligibility requirements as stated on page 7.

To participate in the scholarship program, the graduating senior must meet the following:

- The graduating senior must exhibit animals or fowl in the Killeen Junior Livestock Show.
- 2) Be recommended by their 4H or FFA leader.
- 3) Submit three (3) letters of recommendation.
- 4) Provide official high school transcripts. Official transcripts must be mailed to KJLSA by the exhibitor's school.

The following areas are considered in selection of the recipients:

- 1) A 200-300 word essay. Topic will be published in Jan.
- 2) Poise, verbal expression, and appearance during an inter view by the Scholarship Board.
- Grade point average, class standing, results of SAT/ACT test, and honors courses taken.
- 4) Leadership positions held and extra-curricular activities.

The Scholarship Board will review and score these areas to select the best qualified applicant(s) for awarding scholarships.

In order to receive the scholarship for the Fall Semester, the exhibitor must be enrolled as a full time student at the college of their choice. They will also be required to maintain a Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 to continue receiving the scholarship. Additional funds will be awarded the following Spring, Fall and Spring semester. This scholarship does not cover summer semesters. The payments will be limited to four consecutive semesters or two years, whichever comes first. Please send proof of your semester registration and GPA to KJLSA, P O Box 218, Killeen, TX 76540. The recipients of the scholarships will be announced during the awards ceremony at the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Auction.

### Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association Membership Information

Membership is open to anyone with children in 4-H or FFA or anyone with an interest in agriculture as well as an interest in supporting the youth of our community.

Seven days a week • 3pm and 4:40pm. Support the KJLS Association. A positive test for illegal drugs/substances or disease shall disqualify such animal in the show and shall cause the forfeiture of all funds derived by the owner from the sale of any animal in the show, and the owner shall forfeit any and all trophies and ribbons awarded on any animal entered in the show. The owner of an animal found to have an illegal substance shall be disqualified from entry in subsequent shows for a period of one year.

Disqualification of the Grand Champion or Reserve Champion in any category under this provision shall not result or cause any change in the relative ranking of other animals in the respective category. There shall be no appeal from this provision.

- 9) Bedding: Sand will be furnished for cattle, swine, goats, and sheep. Shavings will be provided for poultry and rabbits only. Exhibitors may place shavings in cattle, swine, goat, and sheep areas at their own expense. Bedding must be maintained in a clean, dry, sanitary condition by the exhibitor. Poultry and rabbit pens must be cleaned at least twice daily. The KJLSA will furnish one bag of shavings per pen. Any additional shavings needed will be the responsibility of the exhibitor. Sand will be used in the arena for all shows and the auction.
- 10) Signs: Exhibitors may post Exhibitor signs.
- 11) Liability: All exhibits will be under the control and direction of the management, but the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association will not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her.
- **12) Officials:** The Killeen Junior Livestock Association will be in complete charge of the show and sale.
- **13) Judges:** The Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association will select all judges for the show. The Judge Selection Committee will bring their recommendations to the board for final approval.
- 14) Arbitration: In case of a disagreement between exhibitors and show officials, the decision of the Arbitration Committee is to be final. The Committee is to be headed by the President of the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association. Members shall consist of Directors from the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association, Vocational Agriculture Teachers from KISD, County Agents and official 4-H adult leaders.
- 15) CLEAN-UP: All exhibitors making the auction sale, receiving prize money for breeding animals, Agriculture mechanics, or cooking shall be required to participate in the clean-up on Friday evening immediately following the Steer Show. All Exhibitors are required to attend the mandatory clean-up on Saturday after the auction. When applicable, a \$75 penalty for each clean-up missed will be retained from their net proceeds. Participants MUST comply with this rule and sign-up sheets will be provided at each clean-up. Any exhibitor who is unable to attend either clean-up or have a substitute clean in their place. The substitute MUST inform the official in charge of the clean-up who he/she is substituting for. The substitute can clean for only one exhibitor. Participants are encouraged to bring brooms, shovels, or anything else that they might need to help clean the barn.
- **16)** No Dogs will be allowed in the barn at any time for any reason.
- 17) NO SCOOTERS, BICYCLES OR HOVER BOARDS are allowed in the barn!!
- 18) Conduct: Unsportsmanlike conduct (i.e. verbal or physical abuse) will be grounds for expulsion of the person from the entire show. If the person is an exhibitor, all projects will be removed. Exhibitors or their representatives (immediate family or legal guardian) who are uncooperative, interfere or show disrespect to officials of the show, judges, or other exhibitors, may have their prize money withheld, be removed from the show and future shows, or any other action that the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Board of Directors deems necessary.

- AG Mechanic Division Rules: Prefabricated projects will not be accepted. Only entries built in a school shop or home shop will be accepted. Entries will not be accepted if they've previously been exhibited at the KJLS. The Ag Mechanic's Division will be split into two categories: Metal and Wood. All completed entries must have an index card attached with ONLY a brief description of what the exhibitor has entered. DO NOT put your name on the card. INDEX CARDS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO ITEM UPON ARRIVALAT SHOW. A notebook with photos of exhibitor building the project, a list of materials and plans will be required in both woodworking and metal categories. All items must be ready to display. Exhibitors must provide their own hangers or stands if needed. Entries will be judged on creativity, artistic design, quality of workmanship, and age appropriateness. Both divisions will have a Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion. A point system for awards will be used. See page 12.
- 20) Cooking Division: The Cooking Division will be split into five categories (classes): Breads, Cookies, Candy, Cakes, and Pies.
  - 1) Breads yeast or quick breads: includes breads, rolls, coffee cakes, kolaches, muffins. 1 loaf or 6 rolls per entry.
  - 2) Cookies (1) Drop Cookies Dough dropped by spoonful, no further shaping; (2) Other Cookies brownies, cut out, bars. 12 cookies per entry.
  - 3) Candy includes divinity, fudge, brittles, pralines, toffee, other. 12 pieces per entry.
  - 4) Cakes (1) Round Cakes 2 layers, angel food, bundt; (2) Other Cakes sheet, cupcakes. 1 cake or 12 cupcakes per entry. Please specify type of container needed.
  - 5) Pies includes nut, 2-crust. NO strawberry or rhubarb. 8" or 9" pan.

**Recipe:** a copy of all recipes (written or typed on a 3x5 card) must accompany each entry. Recipes for frosting, glazes, icings, fillings must be included. DO NOT WRITE THE EXHIBITOR'S NAME ON THE RECIPE CARD. Each exhibitor will be assigned an exhibitor number at the time of check-in.

Preparation: All food must be made from scratch. No cake mixes, ready-made icing or whipped topping, pie crust, filling and/or pudding allowed. NO alcohol. NO fresh fruit for garnishes. NO cream cheese or sour cream in icing. NO decorations or dollies. Cream cheese, sour cream or other perishable ingredients such as eggs, which are blended together and fully cooked are acceptable. Containers will be furnished by the superintendent of the Killeen Junior Livestock Show Association.

**Monetary Awards:** Point money will be given to the top five places in each class. See page 12.

**Country Store:** will be open Friday at the conclusion of the Swine Show. All entries in the Food Division will be placed in the Country Store except for the Grand and Reserve Grand.

- 21) Fitting in the Special Events Center: No Professional Fitters. No animals will be fitted, fed, handled, or attended to at the Killeen Junior Livestock Show by anyone other than an exhibitor, immediate family member (including grandparents), a parent of a 2021 KJLSA exhibitor, or an Agriculture Science Advisor / 4H Leader/Volunteer or Bell County Extension Agent (4H Leaders/Volunteers must be a Bell County Agrillife approved and registered volunteer). Violation of this rule may result in the exhibitor forfeiting all prize money, auction sale money, add-on money, ribbons, banners, buckles, and other awards and may be banned from future shows.
- 22) Classifier: The classifier will have the final ruling on the classification of all market lambs, breeding sheep and breeding cattle.
- 23) Cleaning of Areas: Exhibitors are responsible for the daily cleaning of pens, fitting areas, wash racks, and walk ways. This includes; removing manure and soiled/wet shavings from pens and surrounding areas, sweeping and disposing of hair, wool, and trash of fitting areas. Exhibitors will dispose of waste in the proper designated receptacles.

The KJLSA Board of Directors reserves the right to brand or remove validation tags and leg bands of all animals and fowl being sold through the auction.

### III. AWARDS

- Ribbons for the first ten places will be awarded to the winners at the time of judging. Grand and Reserve Champions will be determined by judging of the first and second place animals in each class against other classes within a division.
- Monetary Awards: Exhibitors eligible for monetary awards will be those with projects in the Breeding Classes, Cooking Division and Ag Mech Division. One point = \$10.00.

7) Showmanship Awards: Judging will be made on the appearance the animal makes before the judge and the skill displayed by the exhibitor in displaying his/her animal. Belt Buckles will be awarded to the Grand and Reserve Champion for Junior Showmanship, ages 13 and under and Senior Showmanship, ages 14 and over, as of January 1st of the show year. Breeding animals may compete in Showmanship.

### **IV. AUCTION**

- All youth who sell in the auction will be required to furnish a "Thank You" note, to their buyer (s). Please turn in "Thank You" notes to your 4-H leader or FFA Instructor. Thank you notes must be enclosed in a stamped envelope and addressed to the buyer(s). All notes must be received within 45 days of the date of the sale, or a fee of \$75.00 will be imposed by the Association and the check will be held until notes are delivered.
- All youth who sell in the auction must deliver the plaque to their buyer within 15 days of receiving plaques.

If the Buyers plaque has not been delivered and a signed receipt from the buyer has not been turned into the KJLSA, (P.O. Box 218, Killeen, TX 76540) a \$50.00 fee will be deducted from the sale money and the check will be held until the plaque is delivered.

- Checks to the exhibitors from their main buyers will be sent out on June 1<sup>st</sup>.
- No breeding animals will be sold at the auction or floor priced. Sifted market animals will not be floor priced.
- 5) All Market animals will be weighed by the Division Superintendent and certified by a Board Member on the first day of the show. Sale weight of all animals shall be the same as the show weight.
- 6) The following is the MAXIMUM NUMBER of animals and fowl that will be sold in the Auction (to include Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions).

- The Grand and Reserve Grand champion winners from the Cooking Division will be sold in the auction.
- All drugs or biologicals must be administered by or with the consent of the show veterinarian, or the attending veterinarian. Failure to conform to this policy may result in subject animal being disqualified. Possession of an illegal drug in the show barn is subject to disqualification and said person will be barred from the premises.
- The top placing animals or fowl will become eligible for the auction. Lower placing animals or fowl will become eligible for the auction sale if one of the top placing animals in the class is withdrawn or ineligible. The lower placing animal or fowl referred to above must come from the class where the animal is withdrawn.
- 10) Exhibitors will be permitted to sell any two animals or fowl. Except, that the same exhibitor must auction all Grand Champions. Categories are as follows: Market Steers, Market Swine, Market Lambs, Meat Goats, Pen of Fryer Rabbits, Single Fryer Rabbit, Pen of Broilers, Market Turkeys, and Roasters.
- 11) Order of Sale will be determined from the order of placing alternating with the different classes of animals. Should an exhibitor fail to have his animal or fowl ready to go into the sale ring on schedule, this may forfeit his/her right to sell.
- 12) All exhibitors must notify the division superintendent of their desire to sell or take home their exhibit within thirty minutes after the conclusion of the steer show. If not notified, exhibit will be sold at floor price.

### V. SIFTING AND CLASSIFICATION

Market Animals - All market animals will be weighed by the Division Superintendent and certified by a Board Member on the first day of the show. This weight will serve as the official weight to class animals as well as the official sale weight.

Breeding Animals - All breeding animals, with the exception of breeding rabbits, will be classed by the Division Superintendent, classifier, and certified by a Board Member on the first day of the show.

### CATTLE DEPARTMENT

Market Steers - To be eligible for the Killeen Junior Livestock Show, steers must be validated at the time of the Bell County Steer Validation. Exhibitors must have owned the animals and had them in their possession by the validation date. Steers must weigh at least 900 pounds at the time of weigh-in. No maximum limit.

Breeding Beef Cattle - No bulls allowed in the show, only females. Breeding cattle must be validated at the time of the Bell County Heifer Validation. Exhibitors must have owned the animals and had them in their possession by the validation date. Breeding cattle do not require breed registration.

Grooming - Cattle should be clipped/fitted prior to entering the barn, although touch up clipping is authorized. Cattle are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Any product used externally to alter the conformation and /or appearance is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, false hair, artificial color, adhesives, or other similar substances. Water, foam, and light oil based products are acceptable.

#### SHEEP DEPARTMENT

Market Lambs - (Wether or ewe lambs) - The exhibitor must have owned the animals and had them in their possession and on feed by County Validation. Animals will be validated at the time of the Bell County Validation (See Page 2). Lambs must weigh at least 90 pounds, 80 pounds for Southdowns at the time of show and have a Bell County Youth Fair or state validation ear tag for proper identification. No variance of weights.

**Grooming** – Must be in accordance with the standard practices. All Market Lambs must be pre-shorn prior to entering the barn, with fleece no longer than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch. Each exhibitor must clean up the floor after shearing. All sheep must show the predominate characteristics of the class in which they are entered, otherwise they will be reclassified by the judge or classifier and will be shown in the Medium Wool classes.

Breeding Sheep – No rams will be allowed in the Breeding Sheep show. The sheep must be validated at the time of the Bell County Sheep Validation. Breeding sheep shown in the breeding class cannot be shown in the market class. All sexually intact sheep must have a USDA Scrapie Eradication ID Tag before entering the Livestock Show barn.

- · All sheep eighteen (18) months of age or older
- · All breeding sheep regardless of age.
- Sexually intact show or exhibition sheep.

### **GOAT DEPARTMENT**

**Meat Goats** — Exhibitors must have owned and had them in their possession and on feed by County Validation. Animals will be validated at the time of the Bell County Validation (See Page 2). Wether or Doe goats may be shown in Meat Goat classes. Goats will be dehorned or may have the horns blunted. Goats will be shown with a halter or collar (no choke chain). Goats must weigh at least sixty (60) pounds. There is no maximum weight limit. Goats will be weighed without restraints. Any underweight entry must be removed from the barn by 9:00 p.m.

**Grooming** – Goats will be shown naturally. No spray paint allowed. Goats must be slick shorn above the knee or hock joints. Goats must be preshorn prior to entering the barn, with hair no longer than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch. Each exhibitor must clean up the floor after shearing. Powder and light sprays are authorized

**Breeding Goats** – All sexually intact meat goats must have a USDA Scrapie Eradication ID Tag before entering the Killeen Junior Livestock Show barn. No Billies are allowed in the Breeding Goat Show. Does (female) shown in the breeding class cannot be shown in the market class. Breeding goats may be slick shorn or in hair. All 1st places of each class will compete for Grand Champion. All goats must be validated at the time of the Bell County Goat Validation.

#### **SWINE DEPARTMENT**

**Market Swine** – (barrows and non-bred gilts) – Exhibitors must have owned the animals and have had them in their possession and on feed by County Validation. Animals will be validated at the time of the Bell County Validation (See Page 2). Weight must be between 220 – 300 pounds at the time of show.

**Grooming** – Exhibitors will not be allowed to use powder, oil, paste or paint on swine. WATER ONLY. Ear tags must be clean.

**Breeding Swine** – Swine must be validated at the time of the Bell County Swine Validation. Breeding swine shown in the breeding class cannot be shown in the market class.

#### **POULTRY DEPARTMENT**

All poultry entering the show grounds must comply with the following mandatory Pullorum-Typhoid program. The 1977 Pullorum Disease and Fowl Typhoid Act requires <u>all</u> poultry going to public exhibition to originate from Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks or hatcheries or have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test prior to exhibition.

Market Show Poultry (Broilers, Roasters, or Turkeys)

- Only Vocational Agriculture Instructors or County Extension Agents can order the poultry for show entries and exhibitors are required to provide wing band numbers and family name to Killeen Livestock Show upon pickup. The person in charge of order/pick-up will also provide a list with family exhibitor name and wing band numbers issued.
- All fowl will be identified by wing bands as per assigned to exhibitor or family. Any fowl that have lost their wing bands regardless of the reason will be sifted. Exhibitor must have owned and cared for poultry since pickup.

- 4) All birds must be fed, watered, and pens kept clean at all times, until after the sale or release by the Poultry Superintendent. Exhibitors must provide their own containers for food and water.
- No substitutions will be allowed after the birds enter the exhibition hall, except in extraordinary circumstances and approved by the Board of Directors.
- 6) There will be a pullet show and a cockerel show. The First Place pen of Cockerels and the First Place pen of Pullets will compete for Grand Champion pen of Broilers. The Second Place pen from which the Grand Champion pen of Broilers was selected will then be allowed to compete for Reserve Grand Champion Broilers.
- 7) 1st 3rd place pullets will sell. 1st 3rd place cockerels will sell.

Broilers — Broilers must be ordered from the Killeen Junior Livestock Association. See IMPORTANT DATES, page 2. (Payment due at time of order. Checks payable to Killeen Junior Livestock Association) Exhibitors must order and pay for 25 or 50 birds, with 50 birds being the maximum allowable order per exhibitor. Cost of Broilers is \$44.00 per order of 25 birds. (Price subject to change). A pen will consist of three (3) birds.

Roasters – Roasters must be ordered and picked up from the Bell County Extension Office. – see IMPORTANT DATES, page 2. Only birds hatched to be shown as Broilers for the Bell County Youth Fair will be eligible for the Killeen Junior Livestock Show as entries. Roaster entries will be a pen of one (1) Poult (hen) only. All entries will be identified by wing bands assigned to exhibitor or family.

**Turkeys** – Turkeys must be ordered and picked up from the Bell County Extension Office – **see IMPORTANT DATES**, **page 2**. Only birds ordered by Vocational Agricultural Instructors and County Extension Agents through the Poultry Department of Texas A&M University will be permitted to be entered. All turkeys will be identified by wing bands assigned per exhibitor or family.

#### RABBIT DEPARTMENT

**Judge** to be licensed by the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA).

**Fryer Rabbits** – Exhibitors must have owned the rabbits and had them in their possession as per validation date. **See IMPORTANT DATES, page 2.** There will be a \$1.00 fee per rabbit for validation. Location for validation will be: 2004 Old Nolanville Road from 6:00 -7:30 pm. For directions, you may call 254-338-4564.

**Pen of Three** – a pen will consist of three (3) rabbits of either sex. Any one fryer shall not weigh more than 5 lbs 8 oz, total pen weight not to exceed 16 lbs 8 oz. It is recommended that the pen be of uniform weight.

Single Fryer Entry – An exhibitor may enter and show one single fryer rabbit for each pen of three (3) fryer rabbits entered. (For clarity, if an exhibitor submits an online entry with payment for a pen of three rabbits and a single rabbit entry, they are eligible to show the single rabbit entry regardless if the pen of three is shown. The single fryer rabbit cannot come from a fryer pen of three (3) that is checked in or exhibited as a pen of three (3). Single fryers must weigh between 3 - 5.5 lbs.

**Breeding Rabbits** - Exhibitors must have owned the rabbit(s) and had them in their possession as per Fryer Validation Date. **See IMPORTANT DATES, page 2.** Breeding rabbits shown in the breeding class cannot be shown in the market (fryer) class.

<u>Breeding Rabbits</u> will be checked in on Friday morning from 7:30-9:00 am. Breeding rabbits will remain in their own carriers. NO PENS WILL BE ASSIGNED FOR BREEDING RABBITS. Breeding rabbits will show immediately after the Fryer and Single Rabbits have been judged.
